Twenty-one enthusiastic PSC members arrived at Hayden Airport on Saturday, January 24. Traveling was uneventful, but the rain on arrival was not a welcome sight. Not to worry - it soon turned to snow, and 14 inches were dumped before we hit the slopes on Sunday when skiing was difficult with deep powder and poor visibility. Monday was much better with part sunshine and more powder - this time of the champagne variety for which Steamboat is famous. Conditions were excellent Tuesday as well, if you could tolerate negative temps. Heavy powder, some wind, and low-light conditions continued on Wednesday and Thursday challenging us Eastern skiers. Finally we were rewarded Friday with a near-perfect day of sunshine and groomed slopes. Danny made us proud with a gold in NASTAR racing. He and others improved their skills with lessons or enjoyed the ambassador tours. We had a few spills on the slopes. Kay returned home with a black eye. Hubby Butch nursed a sore back, claiming it was due more to lifting Kay's 63-lb suitcase than to skiing. (Kay has a totally different story.) Carol had a more serious mishap on the last day, injuring her knee and returning home via wheelchair.

Our accommodations at La Casa condominiums were great with lots of space, excellent bus service, and a location near the slopes. On Sunday we enjoyed a Western Bar BQ with music and dancing at the top of the gondola. Tuesday several of us crashed the Over-the-Hill Gang's happy hour. Wednesday was our second group dinner at Mahogany's, where we were treated to excellent cuisine including lamb shank and bison steak. Our final group dinner on Friday night was a pizza party in the 4-bedroom condo. We shared delicious pizza and stories with old and new friends. Danny provided a humorous magic show and introduced us to Kung Fu Sonny.

During the week group members enjoyed additional activities such as cross country skiing, shopping downtown Steamboat Springs, touring the Storm Peak Lab, visiting the Tread of the Pioneers Museum, and dinner at the Steamboat Yacht Club. The only notable problem of the trip came as we tried to check in at Hayden Airport for our trip home. The consensus was that we had never seen a more disorganized process. It took us about 90 minutes to check in. This was followed by "special screening", where we got a mini-massage as we were screened. 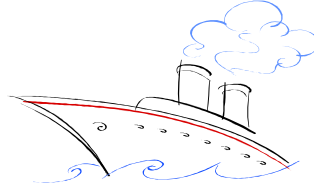

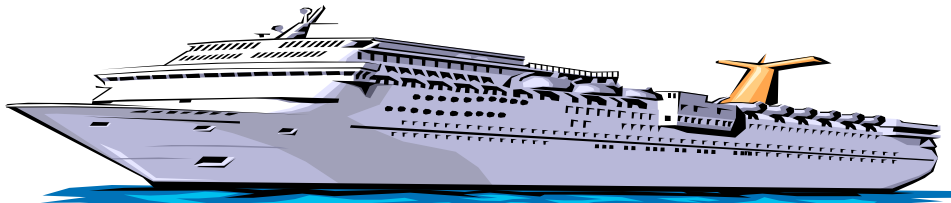
