Join the Peninsula Ski Club for our trip to Telluride, Colorado. www.tellurideskiresort.com Located in the San Juan Mountains of southwest Colorado, Telluride was rated the #11 ski resort in North America by SKI magazine readers in 2009. With 59% green/blue terrain and black diamond "steeps & deeps", the mountain has trails to challenge all levels of ability. Our Bed & Breakfast lodging is only a block from the main street in the town of Telluride and a block from the gondola to Mountainside Village. **To sign up, send your name, address, phone number and email with your deposit check (written to the PSC) to the address at the bottom of this page. It is suggested that you name your roommate when signing up.**

Price Includes: Round trip air to Montrose (see Airline below), transfers between airport and Telluride, 7 nights Bed & Breakfast lodging (2 per room, see Lodging below), 5 days of lift tickets (see Lift Tickets below), breakfast daily, 3 group dinners and pre-trip party.

Airline: United Airlines Norfolk to Montrose via Chicago. This **Saturday to Sunday** trip takes us to **four different mountains** including the **3rd and 4th longest vertical in Canada**. We'll stay **slope side** in exquisite accommodations at **comfortable elevations** while enjoying **up to 7 days of fabulous skiing**, two group dinners, and two Continental breakfasts at a **lower cost per ski day**.

PANORAMA is now one of the Canadian Rockies' premier winter vacation destinations. The resort has almost 3,000 patrolled acres, including bowls, backcountry terrain in Taynton Bowl, the gladed Extreme Dream Zone, terrain parks, and an FIS-regulation halfpipe. Panorama is known for its high percentage of intermediate, advanced, and expert runs and, since everything is below tree line, it has an abundance of glade skiing.



KICKING HORSE was once the haven of heliskiers and riders. Now development is creating one of Canada's most significant new resorts. The resort has a 4,133-foot vertical drop, third in Canada right behind Whistler-Blackcomb. Serious skiers often go to great lengths to find steep, narrow chutes like the 70 at Kicking Horse. For the less daring, there are plenty of intermediate options, such as the 700-acre Crystal Bowl.

FERNIE has snow that is unbelievable—deep and light and almost magical. The terrain appears unlimited—if you see it, and can get to it, you can ski it. There are no crowds, so you have the mountain practically to yourself. Fernie consists of five seemingly limitless bowls of pure delight that dump you into gentle glades, gut-wrenching steeps and chutes, gnarly trees, and thrilling trails. WHITEFISH MOUNTAIN (formerly *Big Mountain*) is in the far northwest corner of Montana near the Canadian border. The resort has 3000 acres of diverse terrain that includes top-to-bottom corduroy groomers, adventurous chutes, as well as massive bowls and glades filled-up on a regular basis with over 25 feet of light northern Montana snow. There are 94 marked runs with half rated intermediate level, 20% beginner-level, and 30% advanced or expert. The runs are long – but the lift lines are not.
