## **STATUS of 2008 Ski Trips:** *(Trips are listed below and updated flyers are attached)*

**Telluride:** The trip has been finalized with 26 people leaving January 12th, 2008 for one of the best locations for skiing and après ski activities in the world.

**Seven Springs:** **This is our only weekend trip.** Please support this trip by **immediately signing up to go!** Trip has **28 signed up** but needs 35.

**Park City:** The Park City trip is filled to capacity with 48 eager skiers. In addition to skiing Deer Valley, The Canyons, and Park City, the club will be going to Snowbasin for the first time. Snowbasin is the site of many downhill racing events for the 2002 Olympics.

**Mount Snow:** Trip has 53 going, room for 80 at the motel, and some seats left on the bus.

**Big Sky:** Ski Magazine readers rated **Big Sky** 7th in the country for terrain/variety and number 26 overall. They call it a "nirvana for skiers". There are rarely lift lines. It offers "long sustained slopes with character", "lots of swoops", a new pedestrian village and new triple chair serving the just opened Dakota Territory. We are staying slope-side. Don't miss this opportunity -- **only six seats left and they will be gone in mid-November.**



**Zillertal:** Trip has 34 people signed up and two spots open.

The Deer Valley, Park City, and Canyons ski resorts are located right at Park City, while Snowbasin is 90 minutes away by bus.

SKI THE SPANISH PEAKS OF THE NORTHERN ROCKIES

**BIG SKY & MOONLIGHT BASIN, MT – FEB 23 – MAR 1, 2008**

**Plans as of May 10, 2007 – All for an estimated \$1606<sup>1</sup>**

**BIG SKY** near Bozeman, Montana, lies nestled in the heart of the Rocky Mountains. Surrounded by the Yellowstone Ecosystem, there is nothing small about the area. The 150 runs covering 85 miles on three separate mountains vary from satin-groomed cruisers to steep, powered chutes and include a new terrain park.
