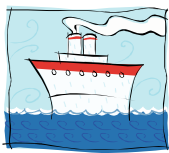
To all skiers and non-skiers of the Peninsula Ski Club:

We will be skiing a different resort nearly every day at four of the best resorts in Utah: Deer Valley, Snowbasin, Park City, and The Canyons. For those unfamiliar, Snowbasin is an uncrowded, upscale ski resort (developed by Sun Valley owners) and hosted many of the downhill events for the 2002 Winter Olympics. The expanded Canyons resort is now the largest in Utah. Deer Valley, everybody's favorite, offers perfectly groomed slopes. The Park City Mtn. ski resort provides lots of skiing for everyone at all levels. The Deer Valley, Park City, and Canyons ski resorts are located right at Park City, while Snowbasin is 90 minutes away by bus.

Park City is an old western mining town. You will enjoy visiting the quaint Old West storefronts on Main Street which house numerous shops, galleries, and restaurants. We will be staying at the newly renovated Park City Peaks Hotel (formerly used the Radisson name, but has same mgt. and ownership), which is conveniently located on the shuttle service line. The hotel provides breakfasts, many amenities, free après-ski beer, and afternoon delivery of hot chocolate and cookies to your room.

SKI THE SPANISH PEAKS OF THE NORTHERN ROCKIES

BIG SKY & MOONLIGHT BASIN, MT - FEB 23 - MAR 1, 2008

BIG SKY near Bozeman, Montana, lies nestled in the heart of the Rocky Mountains. Surrounded by the Yellowstone Ecosystem, there is nothing small about the area. The 150 runs covering 85 miles on three separate mountains vary from satin-groomed cruisers to steep, powered chutes and include a new terrain park. A lift network with a 15-passenger tram, 4 high-speed quads, 2 triple- and 6 double- chairlifts, a gondola, and several surface lifts serves the mountain. Leave the crowds, lift lines, and pretense behind – ski a place that's all your own.

MOONLIGHT BASIN, one of the newest ski resorts in the US, is located on the north side of Lone Mountain, adjacent to Big Sky. PSC Now a Member of the Blue Ridge Ski Council
